



While walking, I noticed this tree on the pathway (see pic). What do you see? I chuckled because it reminded me of the story of Jesus healing the blind man and the man told Jesus that he could see people but they looked like walking trees.

I sometimes feel this way when trying to see what God sees for our church or for my life. Don't you? You kinda-sorta see or understand what God's will is, you might have a general idea, but the fine details, the clarity of sight to take the big step isn't quite in focus yet. - 6) Get ready for the ice-cream social on Sunday August 20 at 5:00 p.m. Yummy!




