The service will be held in the sanctuary on Thursday, December 21st at 7:00 p.m. It will consist of songs, scripture readings, meditation and reflection, prayer and lighting of candles.

If you need a time and space to acknowledge the blue of Christmas, please join us. (I promise – no versions of Elvis' "Blue Christmas" allowed.) If you are not experiencing a sense of loss this holiday season, but know someone who is, there is no greater gift that you could give them, but to come and just be present with them during this time.
